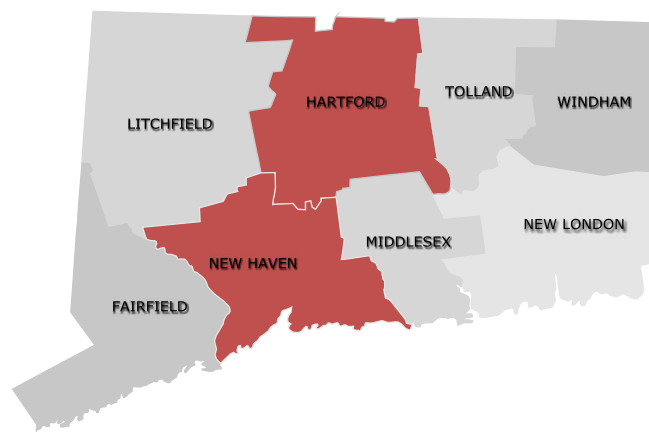

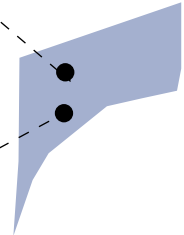
SEP PURPOSE
